Inhalte	Working on stories, narratives, daily life experiences and “body language” manifestations in order to see the possibilities to create alternative strategies in doing theatre and art. Strategies that could play on the notions of truth and untruth, reality and fiction, strategies that try to blur the traces, passing from one side to the other without borders, reversing the signs, stirring up the norms and shaking up certainty, discovering the role of politics in order to create a new ‘unreal’ reality or a virtual one. In this workshop, Rabih Mroué will present some of the concepts on which he has worked and introducing some artworks in order to open up discussions with the participants on how we could deal with topics such as memory, disappearance, voids, absence, rumours and war in relation to the idea of documents... The workshop will take the form of an open dialogue with participants from different art disciplines.
