Inhalte How to approach art & life to create sustainable ecosystems and to better our lives? We will address that question practice centred and case-oriented. Jatiwangi art Factory (JaF) is internationally well-known for its contemporary art, its Music Triennale, tv and radio stations etc. Currently, together with the Majalengka district government, JaF runs the long-term project Terracotta City. Through discussing the Terracotta Universe City, we will address art & eco-materials, art & policymaking, art & politics, and action & research together with JaF and guests.

The ten-days Praxisseminar includes on- and offline sessions with close readings, media-rich activities, workshops, talks, individual and group work.

Each day will start with a close reading session,* followed by a workshop and – in the afternoons — talks and discussions.

Jatiwangi art Factory is an artist group based on Java, Indonesia. In 2018 JaF won the prestigious Bhinneka Award at Art Stage Jakarta. The award acknowledges socio-political significant art initiatives that advance unity and togetherness of the society. International headlines also made JaF's contribution to the 2017 Asian Art Biennale "Negotiating the Future" where they staged an investor meeting. Part of their network, among many other initiatives, is also Ruangrupa, the curator team of the Documenta 15. <https://jatiwangiartfactory.tumblr.com/>

Prof. Dominique Lämmli is an artist, philosopher, educator, and researcher; runs FOA-FLUX (foa-flux.net) and mAIA GmbH (maia.vision), and holds the professorship Drawing & Painting at the MA Fine Arts, ZHdK. Dr. Nils Röller is Professor for Media and Cultural Theory. In his practice he explores contemporary poetic strategies (romanform.ch). His current Research Project focusses on Visual Philosophy (iconographyofphilosophy.ch).

Pascal Sidler is a painter, currently working as a teaching assistant at the MA Fine Arts. His paintings are often based on photographs from everyday life. His work has been shown in various exhibitions, including "European Southern Observatory", Hamlet in Zürich (2019). In 2019 he was the recipient of the Grant of the City of Zurich and in 2013 of the Grant of the Canton of Zurich.
