Lernziele / Kompetenzen	 To get an understanding of aspects of institutional art history, art journalism and innovative and politically engaged philanthropy
Inhalte	A study of innovative and politically engaged patrons in the arts with a focus in women philanthropists and gallerists who highly influenced the landscape of cultural avant-garde movements and institutions, with an outlook on today's globally changing scene of contemporary personalities and foundations. Women like Katherine Dreier or Dominique de Menil were among these exceptional protagonists: the older an international leader of the Suffragette movement and the founder of the Société Anonyme, the forerunner of the Museum of Modern Art, the other – a former student of physics and mathematics at the Sorbonne – an active advocate of the Civil Rights movement, while initiating the Rothko Chapel, one of the most legendary sites of post-war American modernism. Anke Kempkes (*1968) is an international curator, scholar and critic, currently based in Warsaw. Special focus on feminist art history, avant-garde theory and queer performativity. She studied at the Courtauld Institute of Art and contributed to numerous publications and conferences worldwide. She held the position of
